St Patrick's Mental Health Services is Ireland's largest independent, not-for-profit mental health service provider, providing inpatient and Homecare through our three approved centres; St Patrick's University Hospital, St Patrick's Hospital, Lucan, and Willow Grove Adolescent Unit, as well as community and outpatient care through our nationwide Dean Clinic network.

As an independent organisation and a registered charity, St Patrick's Mental Health Services is governed by Royal Charter through our Board of Governors who have overall responsibility for internal control procedures.

What we do

St Patrick's Mental Health Services provides a range of mental healthcare services for adolescents and adults, and offers remote access to its services. We provide care and treatment for addictions and dual diagnosis, anxiety disorders, bipolar disorder, depression, eating disorders, psychosis and mental health difficulties in older adults, as well as in young adults.

Grounded in a human rights-based ethos, we work to provide the highest quality mental healthcare; to promote mental wellbeing and mental health awareness; to advocate for the rights of those experiencing mental health difficulties; and to enhance our evidence-based knowledge through active and innovative and research.
